





STS-Med project: boosting concentrated solar technology in the Med area



Main results

- A new Euro-Mediterranean supply chain of 40 SMEs and 950 professionals qualified in CS Technology
- 20,000 end users served by the 4 demonstration plants commissioned in Italy, Jordan, Egypt and Cyprus
- 460 Kilowatt-thermal (KWth) of power installed

The partnership: a mix between academia, businesses and public organizations from Italy, Cyprus, Egypt, France, Greece, Jordan
